1	Phase I	Foundational Knowledge (Geography, dispatched agencies, equipment used, codes and alphabet, organizational etc.)	\$12.04
2.5	Phase II	Foundational Skill (further depth in foundational knowledge adding the development of skills to use the associated tools and interact with callers and responders)	\$12.04
4	Phase III	On the Job (training is plugged in with a trainer, receiving coaching and correction while skills are being developed)	\$16.06
2.5	Phase IV	On the Job Supervised (trainee is working calls by themselves, while being supervised by their trainer)	\$16.06
3	Academy	Two week Dispatch academy and three day Emergency Medical Dispatch training at the DPSST in Salem	based upon scheduling restrictions typically \$16.06
	Solo Status	Trainee has completed their Call Taker training and will perform on their own until they reach the time requirement to apply for their certification	\$16.90
